

C. A. BRAMAN ASKS DIVORCE

Broker Sues Wife, a Cousin of Mrs. F. D. Roosevelt

RENO, Nev., Sept. 10—Chester A. Braman, New York broker, filed suit today to divorce Mrs. Anna E. R. Hall Braman, a cousin of Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, on a charge of mental cruelty.

A cross-complaint is anticipated and the wife is expected to take the decree when the case is tried in a few days. An agreement has been reached for the custody and support of the couple's three children.

They were married on June 3, 1925, in the Church of the Epiphany in New York, a reception following at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, at 49 East Sixty-fifth Street. As Miss Anna Eleanor Roosevelt Hall, daughter of Edward L. Hall, Mrs. Braman was introduced to society two years before her marriage, also at Mrs. Roosevelt's home.

Mr. Braman is the son of the late Chester Alwyn Braman, who was president of A. D. Juilliard & Co., textile manufacturers, of New York. He graduated from Princeton in 1925, and is a member of the Union League in New York, also the Church, Rockaway Hunting and Meadow Brook Clubs.
