

BRAMAN FUNERAL PLANS.

Services for Head of A. D. Juilliard & Co. to Be Held Tomorrow.

The funeral of Chester Alwyn Braman, president of A. D. Juilliard & Co., Inc., who died at his home, 539 West End Avenue, Thursday after a long illness, will take place at All Angels' Church, Eighty-first Street and West End Avenue, tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. The Rev. Dr. S. Delancey Townsend, pastor emeritus of the church, will officiate, assisted by the Rev. Dr. Cornelius P. Trowbridge.

The fourteen honorary pallbearers will include six officers and directors of A. D. Juilliard & Co., Frederic A. Juilliard, Duncan D. Sutphen, Robert Westaway, Philip M. Smith, George W. Retz and Oscar Schwarz, also Dr. John Grier Hibben, president of Princeton University; Victor A. Lerner, president of Bowery Savings Bank; George W. Davison, president of the Central Union Trust Company; Alexander F. Hobbs, John C. Juhring, Barron Collier, M. J. Averbeck and William Warren Barbour. Burial, which will be private, will be in Woodlawn Cemetery.

A spokesman for the family said yesterday that Mr. Braman's contributions to the Princeton University Chapel, the south transept of which bears his name, ran into the hundreds of thousands of dollars and were nearer \$500,000 than the \$50,000 mentioned in THE NEW YORK TIMES of yesterday.
