She was introduced to society during the season of 1947 at the Junior Assemblies and at a dinner dance given for her by her father in November of that year. She will be graduated next month from Vassar College.

Miss Braman is a granddaughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Chester A. Braman and the late Mr. and Mrs. Edward L. Hall of New York.
