

MRS. C. A. BRAMAN, ACTIVE IN CHARITY

Clubwoman Here, Widow of
Textile Man, Dies—Started
Constitution Defense Fund

Mrs. Mary Richards Braman, widow of Chester Alwyn Braman, former president of A. D. Juilliard & Company, textile commission house, died on Wednesday in her home at 800 Park Avenue. Born in Mauch Chunk, Pa., she was a daughter of Alexander W. and Mary Richards Butler.

Mrs. Braman was active for many years in charitable work and in the affairs of the Women's National Republican Club, to which she gave \$5,000 in 1934 as a "Fund for the Defense of the Constitution." During the first World War, she was chairman of the Hospital Committee of the Churchwomen's League for Patriotic Service.

She was a member of the Colony Club, vice president of the Society of Pennsylvania Women, member of the board of St. Luke's Home for Aged Women, and a trustee of Town Hall.

Surviving are a son, Chester A. Braman of Old Chatham, N. Y.; two grandsons, Chester A. Braman Jr. of the Navy, and Lawrence J. Braman, and two granddaughters, Eleanor Roosevelt Braman and Mary Lawrence Braman.
